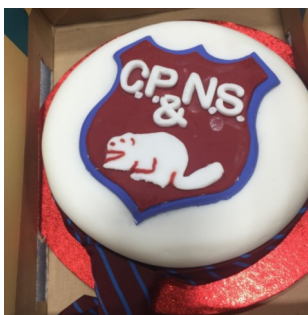


The Great Corrie Bake Off.
