National School Sports Week	£4579.06 (£1300 for Flat Stan and £115 for Wacky Woody from 2018 funding round)	<p>-To provide the children with a wide variety of experiences and opportunities to take part in a range of activities related to health and fitness.</p> <p>-To provide the children with a pathway to continue any of the sports or experiences they particularly enjoyed outside of school by giving them contact details of local clubs etc. if they showed an interest.</p>	<p>-Sports and Health Week was a huge success in school. Funding was used to provide the children with opportunities to take part in the following activities during the week in addition to the many other opportunities the children were given during the week:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Climbing Wall. -Healthy Cooking. -Rugby. -Athletics. -Street Dance. -Thai Boxing. -Gymnastics. -Handball. -Basketball. -Bollywood Dancing. -Zumba. -Football. -Circus Skills. <p>-We also used funding to provide all the children in school, including the nursery children, with the opportunity to take part in an hour of first aid training through the Flat Stan company during sports week. This was an invaluable opportunity for the children and really gave them a good basic grasp of first aid techniques.</p> <p>-Awards have been paid for out of the PE premium budget to provide an incentive for children to take part in school sport throughout the course of the year. These awards are highly sought after amongst the children and are considered really prestigious.</p> <p>-Mr. Griffin carried out a parent voice questionnaire during Sports and Health week and received</p>

Subscription to Maths of the Day Software	£495	To provide teachers with an resource enabling them to develop active maths sessions in their classes, with a focus for this being on target groups of children who may find maths difficult and be reluctant learners.	-We have also purchased the ‘Maths of the Day’ online resource which allows teachers lots of ideas and resources to provide active maths sessions as part of their daily maths activities. This has been really well received and is aimed at particularly incentivising children who may find maths hard to join in more eagerly with maths activities. It also has the advantage of providing additional activity sessions for the children.

CPD Cover- Mondays across both Key Stages	£3200	Use of an additional coach on Mondays to address teachers concerns and areas in which they perceive themselves to be less confident in the teaching of PE. The coach is used to support the teachers in the delivery of units of work from the Val Sabin scheme. The teacher delivers some of the sessions with the coach after initially watching and then working with the coach.	-Staff have continued to express an increased confidence in teaching PE through use of the Val Sabin scheme and through training needs being addressed. The use of an additional sports coach has improved this confidence further and has led to much more flexibility of approach within the use of the Val Sabin scheme, moving away from the rigidity of the sessions into a more creative approach. Incorporated within this has been use of Sports Premium money to employ a sports development coach on Mondays to specifically work with staff who have expressed the need for support in a particular area (usually gym and dance) to deliver CPD. This has been really successful as it has allowed teachers to build areas of confidence that they themselves were particularly concerned about. -Increased confidence of teachers using Val Sabin Scheme of Work. -Improved coverage of all curriculum areas in PE lessons from use of Val Sabin Scheme of Work- Observed by PE Co-ordinator. All teachers have been following the Curriculum map and teaching all aspects of PE as suggested by the curriculum map at the correct times.

			-Progression in all strands of PE has improved through implementation of the new scheme. Skills are being taught at the right stage for all children and are not being duplicated across year groups or Key Stages. This has been noted through observations and walk-throughs.

It also provides opportunities to share ideas and best practise with other PE leads.</p> <p>-The subscription to the partnership also provides school with the license to sign up for all School Games competitions run by the partnership which provide the children with many opportunities for Inter-School competitions throughout the year and also links to the School Games award, at which we currently hold the Silver Standard.</p> <p>-Through our link with the Tameside Sports Partnership, we have increased our participation in Sainsbury's School Games events from 9 to 11 this year, providing lots of our children</p>

			with opportunities to take part in competitive sport. -Through the Skills 2 Play initiative and the Energy Club initiative, (both of which were brought to our attention through the Tameside Sports Partnership), we have provided our year 6 playleaders with training to allow them to provide more exciting and diverse sessions for our younger children at lunchtimes. We have had 25 playleaders leading activities through the course of this year.
