Find a picture of an ocean, can you name it and describe it? Use lots of adjectives to describe the waves and creatures in it.	Mermaids are mythical water creatures. Draw a picture of your own mythical creature and describe it.	You and three friends are rowing in a boat. You are sitting one behind the other. How could you be sitting? Find all the possibilities. How will you present your ideas?
