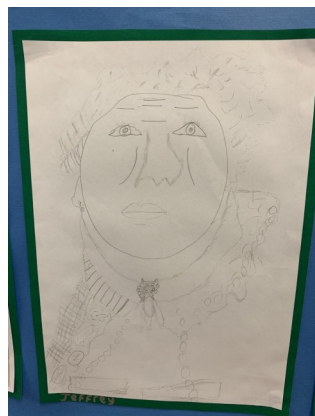
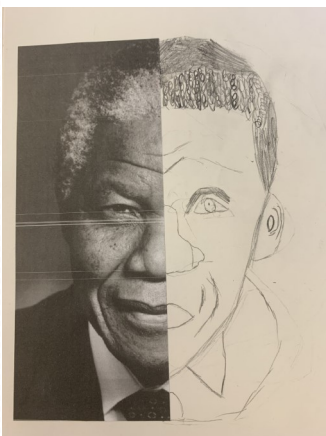
Black History Month 2020

The children have been busy learning about their life and the adversity that they faced and have also created some fantastic pieces of work.



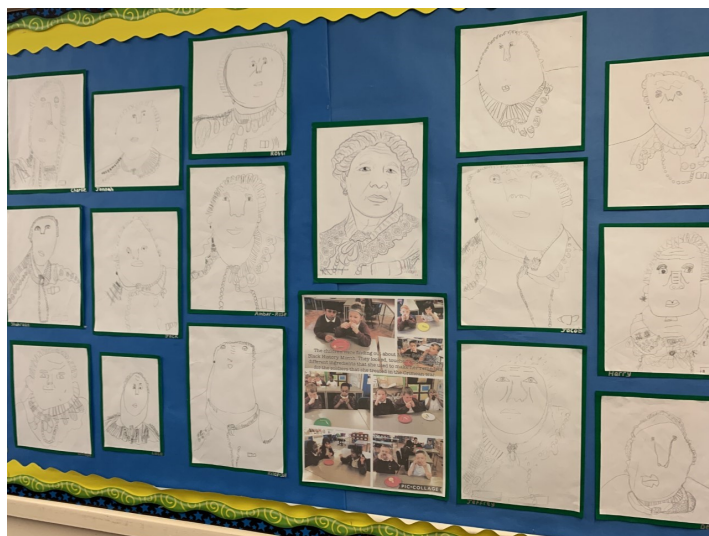
