Subscription to Maths of the Day Software	£545	To provide teachers with an resource enabling them to develop active maths sessions in their classes, with a focus for this being on target groups of children who may find maths difficult and be reluctant learners.	-We have also purchased the 'Maths of the Day' online resource which allows teachers lots of ideas and resources to provide active maths sessions as part of their daily maths activities. This has been really well received and is aimed at particularly incentivising children who may find maths hard to join in more eagerly with maths activities. It also has the advantage of providing additional activity sessions for the children.

We have had 25 playleaders leading activities through the course of this year.</p>
