#### My very own book illustration.


For Christmas last year, I was given an opportunity to design my own character for a book (Night Zookeeper).

# Coronavirus testing

If your child has any of the covid-19 symptoms; a cough / high temperature / a loss of or change to their sense of taste/smell you should:

• inform school and immediately arrange a PCR test at a test centre. Your child will be allowed back in school when we have seen a negative PCR test result.

If your child has been isolating following a positive Lateral Flow Test, they can come back to school on day 6 providing that they have a negative lateral flow test on day 5 and day 6 at least 24 hours apart. The day of the test is classed as day 0.

## Year 1

#### Year 1 have been having lots of fun on the new climbing frame in Key Stage 1







Year 1 received a letter from Professor Nora Wilde who works as Palaeontologist at Manchester University. We were informed that a rare dinosaur egg had disappeared along with eight frozen dinosaur eggs from The Manchester Museum and they needed our help to find them!

Just as we'd finished reading our letter, Year 1 heard a series of very loud thud noises and a loud 'ROAR' coming from outside. The children were excited to find a large dinosaur egg sitting in a straw nest. We followed some footprints into the playground and the children hunted around to retrieve eight frozen dinosaur eggs! We carefully took them back to the classroom and followed Professor's instructions to find the quickest way to thaw the eggs. We set up a Science investigation and placed the eggs in different conditions to see which egg thawed the quickest. The children asked lots of questions, used their information to design a science investigation and took turns to share their ideas and predictions.

During the afternoon, children took turns to each measure, observe and record their findings on a sheet and we were able to make conclusions about which conditions worked the quickest and slowest to thaw the dinosaur eggs.















Year 2 Year 3

This term Year 2 pupils have noticed something strange in school - dragons! We found dragon tails hiding around the school playground and then a dragon hiding in the reading garden. We have begun to read our new English book: The Dragon Machine by Helen Ward and Wayne Anderson. We are looking forward to finding out how the main character (George) deals with the dragons he finds!

- if you are making a payment, please click Add to Basket and then click the Basket icon in the top
  right corner of the screen you can add debit / credit card details and payment is immediately
  received by school.
- If you click bank transfer ParentPay have to wait for your bank to process this. For an initial set up and payment, it can take up to 10 working days to be authorised. However, subsequent payments should be processed in 3-5 working days.
- Until the payment status shows as paid on our ParentPay system we cannot pass uniform / water bottles to you or your child.

The Payment Report is ran at 8:30 am each morning, items ordered after this time will be passed to you or your child the following day.
