

Nursery Places September 2022

If your child has their 3rd birthday before 31 August 2022 you can apply now for a Nursery place in September 2022.

Parents have the option of choosing mornings / afternoon only or all day. You may be eligible to claim the additional 15 hours for the afternoon session via https://www.gov.uk/apply-30-hours-free-childcare

If you do not qualify, you can still have an additional 15 hours (to make 30 hours) at a charge payable via ParentPay.

If you are interested or know anyone who would be interested, please feel free to let them know. Application Forms are on the school website or available from Junior Reception.

Please apply asap as places are allocated in the order that applications are received and you may need to give 1 months' notice to your child's existing Nursery.

Welcome back to the Summer Term! We had a lovely start to the term by celebrating Eid with our children during our RE lesson. We have also been very busy in Science learning about all about plants. We have been busy growing our own Sun Flowers, the children have been exploring the school grounds to collect leaves so that we can identify and describe them using our observation skills. We have kicked off our Pirates topic, 'Ooooo Arrrgh!' with a swashbuckling treasure hunt around school where children have been busy hunting for pirate clues and treasure.















Year 2 Year 3

Year 2 Forum

This half-term, the children in Year 2 have been learning about 'being healthy' in their jigsaw lessons. First the children learned about the main food groups and a balanced plate.

Then, the children thought about snacks they liked eating and they discussed how snacks could be healthy; they made and tasted fruit kebabs and avocado oatcakes.



Later, the children designed and made their own healthy snack which was a rice cake face, made with hummous and a range of vegetables. In English, they wrote instructions explaining how to make their healthy snack recipes







This half term the children in 3L have started their topic on Extreme Earth. They enjoyed making a model of the Earth from coloured salt dough to show all the different layers. When they cut the Earth in half they could see these clearly. They have investigated earthquakes and volcanoes and practised what to do in the event of an earthquake. We have been reading Escape from 'Pompeii' by Christina Balit and in our English lessons the children have written poetry and plays and acted them out. They completed their own extract from the story too. Another busy half term!
