Year 1 – Summer Term

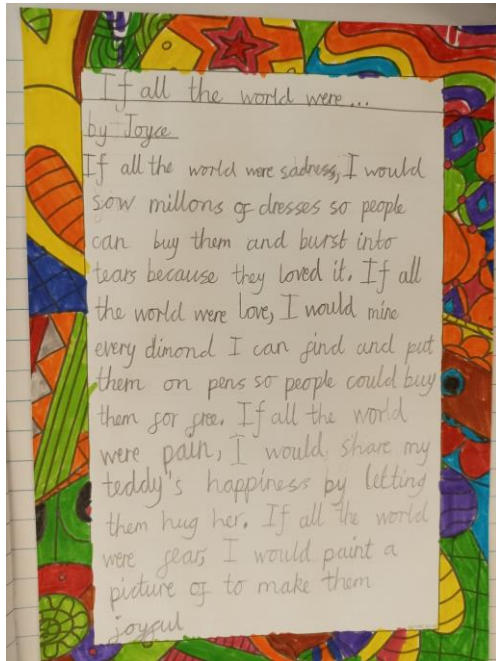
