Children were given multiple opportunities to try a range of new sports and because we have purchased the equipment to try these sports, teachers have been able to follow up on interest in the sports subsequent to the sports week. Also, we have been able to work with Kickstart to incorporate some of these sports into the curriculum.</p> <p>We will now use this as a blueprint for our future sports week, selecting different sports each year, to build up a large resource and knowledge base to provide the children with the widest range of sporting opportunities possible in school.</p>
