Reading needs a higher % of PP children above than there is currently.</p> <p>Year 5: Smaller % in general below or at risk for reading, and higher % above, but 0 PP children significantly above. In writing, no PP children are above. In maths, significantly higher % of PP children below or at risk whilst no PP children are significantly above.</p>
